Opinion Shifts To Nixon on Tenure

PRINCETON, N.J.—Public opinion has shifted slightly in favor of President Nixon on the issue of resignation, with 49 per cent against his resigning compared to 42 per cent in favor. An early-January survey showed opinion evenly divided, 46 to 46 per cent.

On the question of impeachment, the current vote is 51 to 38 per cent opposed. These findings, based on a survey conducted the weekend following Mr. Nixon's State of the Union message Jan. 30, closely match those recorded in an early-January survey. That poll showed a 53 to 37 per cent division of opinion.

Here are four statements concerning President Nixon's connection with the Watergate affair. Will you tell me which one comes closest to you own point of view? (A) Nixon planned the Watergate bugging from the beginning. (B) Nixón did not plan the bugging but knew about it before it took place. (C) Nixon found out about the bugging after it occurred, but tried to cover it up. (D) Nixon had no knowledge of the bugging and spoke up as soon as he learned about it.
