FEB 2 0 1974 HEARING SET ON BID TO SUBPOENA NIXON

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19 — A
hearing has been scheduled
March 15 in Superior Court
here to resolve an attempt by
John D. Ehrlichman and two
other former White House aides
to subpoena President Nixon as
a witness at their upcoming
trial in Los Angeles.

A request for Mr. Nixon's
testimony by attorneys for Mr.
Ehrlichman and the two others,
David R. Young Jr. and G.
Gordon Liddy, was approved
earlier this month by Judge
Gordon S. Ringer of the Los
Angeles County Superior Court.
The defendants argued, and
Judge Ringer agreed, that Mr.
Nixon's testimony about the
creation of the White House
"plumbers" investigating unit
was "necessary and material,"
to their defense of a burglary
charge arising from one of the
"plumbers" operations.
The court here may either
uphold Judge Ringer's finding
and issue a subpoena for the
President's personal appearance
or dismiss the subpoena effort.
It would be the first time an
incumbent President had been
subpoenaed by a state court in
connection with a criminal case.
