Kalmbach pleaded guilty in U.S. District Court here Monday to secretly raising millions of dollars and peddling an ambassadorship in an illicit 1970 fund-raising operation organized by the White House.

He promised to cooperate with Watergate prosecutors in return for immunity other charges that might have been lodged against him, but he still faces a maximum pen-alty of three years in prison and \$11,000 in fines for the

campaign-law violations.

Although one of the offenses is a felony, disbarment is not automatic under California law of the california law violations. nia law. Certified copies of the court records in Kalmbach's case will first be sent to the California supreme court with a letter from state bar officials stating whether they think the crimes involve moral turpitude.

Carl H. Heil. disciplinary counsel for the California state bar, said the court can order hearings by the bar association to sociation to recommend what disciplinary action to take or to restudy the question of whether the crimes are seri-ous enough to warrant any action. The final decision is up

to the state supreme court.
It was unclear when It was unclear whether Kalmbach would continue to do Mr. Nixon's legal work now that he has left his own firm, but the California lawyer told reporters in federal court Monday that he is still the President's personal attorney. Kalmbach's office said yesterday that there has been "no change in relationship" between him and the President.
