H. R. HALDEMAN — Former White House chief of staff; one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice; one count of obstruction of justice; three counts of periury.

JOHN D. EHRLICHMAN
—Former top domestic adviser to President Nixon:
one count of conspiracy to
obstruct justice; one count
of obstruction of justice;
one count of lying to FBI
agents and two counts of
lying to a grand jury.

JOHN N. MITCHELL — Former Attorney General and director of President Nixon's 1972 re-election

CHARLES W. COLSON — Former Special White House counsel: one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice; one count of obstruction of justice.
