The Charges In Brief

Washington

Here, at a glance, are the indictments returned by the Watergate grand jury:

H. R. HALDEMAN — Former White House chief of staff; one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice; one count of obstruction of justice; three counts of perjury.

JOHN D. EHRLICHMAN — Former top domestic adviser to President Nixon: one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice; one count of obstruction of justice; one count of lying to FBI agents and two counts of lying to a grand jury.

JOHN N. MITCHELL — Former Attorney General and director of President Nixon's 1972 re-election

campaign: one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice; one count of obstruction of justice; two counts of lying to a grand jury; one count of perjury; one count of lying to FBI agents.

CHARLES W. COLSON — Former Special White House counsel: one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice; one count of obstruction of justice.

ROBERT C. MARDIAN — Former head of the Justice

Department's Internal Security Division and a political coordinator for President Nixon's re-election campaign: one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice.

KENNETH W. PARKINSON — Lawyer retained by the Committee to Re-Elect the President in connection with the civil suit filed against it by the Democratic National Committee after the Watergate break-in: one count of conspiracy to ob-

struct justice; one count of obstruction of justice.

GORDON C. STRACHAN — Former lawyer in New York law firm in which President Nixon and Mitchell were once partners, later personal assistant to Haldeman at the White House: one count of conspiracy to obstruct justice; one count of obstruction of justice; one count of lying to a grand jury.
