Gov. Reagan
Says 'Justice
Will Prevail'

Governor Ronald Reagan, a leading Republican contender for President in 1976, said yesterday that he is confident "justice finally will prevail" in the Watergate scandal.

Reagan issued the statement shortly after a grand jury in Washington returned indictments against seven former top aides of President Nixon in the Watergate bugging and coverup.

The governor, who has supported Mr. Nixon during the controversy, said the cases of the seven "are now before the courts where innocence or guilt will be determined. This is the proper course and I am confident that justice finally will prevail."
