

Nixon talks to his advisers

WASHINGTON — President Nixon met with his closest advisers yesterday apparently to review legal options following the new Watergate indictments.

Officials said he would continue to stand on his repeated statements of "noninvolvement" in the break-in and cover-up.

White House aides gave no hint of their next move. But sources said "they're churning it round here" about the secret report the federal grand jury submitted Friday to U.S. District Judge John Sirica along with the indictment of seven former Nixon White House and campaign aides.

White House officials dismissed as "pure speculation" reports Nixon's Watergate lawyers may seek to block Sirica from turning the grand jury report and a briefcase of information over to the House Judiciary Committee for its impeachment investigation.
