**Impeachment Doubted
By a Top Nixon Aide**

DETROIT, March 4 (AP)—
The top woman in the Nixon
Administration said today
the President would not be
impeached and "will regain,
inch-by - inch, percentage
point-by - percentage point,
the confidence of the Ameri-
can people."

Mrs. Anne Armstrong of
the Cost of Living Council,
said she believed the House
of Representatives would
find there was no case
against the President.

"There've been allegations
by the thousands, but there
is no evidence," she said at
a news conference. "I think
there is no grounds for im-
peachment."

Mrs. Armstrong said she
saw no evidence to implicate
the President in Watergate
or to connect political con-
tributions by the dairy lobby
and International Telephone
& Telegraph corporation to
policies of the Administra-
tion.
