F.B.I. CHECKS THREAT MADE TO GOVERNORS

MADE TO GOVERNORS BOSTON, March 3 (UPI)— The Federal Bureau of Investi-gation said Sunday it "was han-dling" reports of letters sent to five New England Governors by the kidnappers of Patricia Hearst, the newspaper heiress. A spokesman for the F.B.I. would not say whether the agency was formally investi-gating the apparently identical letters but did say, "The F.B.I. does have information of the letters and are handling it." The five Governors said Sat-urday they had received mime-ographed letters signed by Field

The five Governors said Sat-urday they had received mime-ographed letters signed by Field Marshal Cinque, the name given by the leader of the kid-nappers, who call themselves the Symbionese Liberation Army. At least three of the Gov-ernors said they did not take the letters seriously. Gov. Meldrim Thomson Jr. of New Hampshire, the first to disclose receipt of the letter, described it as "a threat." The other Governors to receive let-ters are Kenneth M. Curtis of Maine, Francis W. Sargent of Massachusetts, Thomas R. Sal-mon of Vermont and Philip W. Noel of Rhode Island. Mr. Thomson declined to say whether he had been threatened with death or injury but said the mailed threat did include a "demand that certain things be 3- done."
