

A Harder Look at Nixon Taxes

Congressional investigators of President Nixon's income taxes are going into a half dozen areas in addition to the two Mr. Nixon suggested, sources said yesterday.

When Mr. Nixon asked for the probe in December, he proposed that the Senate-House Committee on Internal Revenue Taxation and its staff look into his deductions for a gift to the National Archives of vice presidential papers valued at \$576,000 and his nonpayment of capital gains taxes on the sale of part of his property at San Clemente, Calif.

It was estimated that, if the committee held these to be improper, Mr. Nixon might have to pay an additional \$300,000 in federal income taxes.
