Ford Not Expecting New 'Bombshells' In Watergate Case

TAMPA, Fla., March 8—Vice President Ford said today that he did not believe there would be further Watergate "bombshells."

"I know of no more bombshells," he said. "I don't think there will be any."

His comments came in response to questions at a news conference earlier today in Bal Harbour before he flew here tonight.

Asked how extensively the President is keeping him briefed on the White House strategy on Watergate, Mr. Ford replied:

"I think the President has kept me very well informed. I had advance notices there would be more press conferences. I was informed there would be greater cooperation, I think good cooperation, as far as the House Committee on Judiciary is concerned."

Mr. Ford flew to Florida today for fund-raising gatherings benefiting Saint Leo College, a private Roman Catholic institution, and the University of Tampa.

Both appearances were made at the request of an old Republican friend and former House colleague of Mr. Ford, William C. Cramer, now a lawyer in Florida and Washington.
