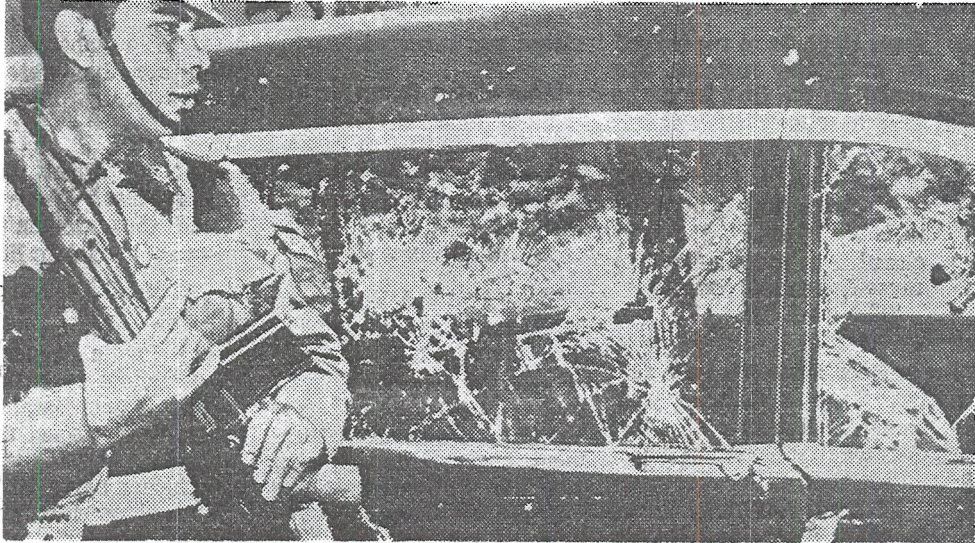


## 'No fear' for Pat on

## her return to Caracas

WASHINGTON — First lady Pat Nixon says she has no fear about returning tomorrow to Caracas, where 16 years ago she and her husband were mobbed, spat upon and stoned.

Caracas is the first stop on Mrs. Nixon's six-day, 9,195-mile trip to attend presidential inaugurations in Venezuela and Brazil — her third solo diplomatic venture since her husband became President.

Her arrival tomorrow is bound to bring back vivid memories of the day in 1958 when she and then-Vice President Nixon were ambushed by angry leftist demonstrators who smashed the windows of their limousines, spat on them and chanted: "Death to Nixon."

Sources in Venezuela said authorities have established strict security measures for the arrival of Mrs. Nixon and dignitaries from 47 other nations, including armed escorts and constant bomb checks at all ceremony sites.

On Tuesday, Mrs. Nixon will attend the inaugural ceremonies for Carlos Andres Perez, a 51-year-old former interior minister who was elected president last Dec. 9. Perez comes into power at a crucial time in relations between the United States and Venezuela.

On Friday, Mrs. Nixon will be in Brasilia for the swearing-in of Ernesto Geisel, 65, a retired army general, who was named as the country's 28th president last Jan. 15.
