## Most Feel President Should Give Up Data

By 54 to 32 per cent, a majority agrees with the statement that "if President Nixon fails to turn over the information the House Judiciary Committee wants, that committee should vote to bring up impeachment charges against the President." This sentiment takes on added significance because an even larger segment of the public, 64 to 17 per cent, does not expect Mr. Nixon "to turn over all the evidence to the House Judiciary Committee."

When people were asked why they feel the way they do about the House Judiciary Committee recommending a vote on impeachment if Mr. Nixon fails to produce evidence believed to be in his possession, here are the reasons they gave for reaching their conclusions:
