Maryland Bar Association
Bids Court Disbar Agnew

ANNAPOLIS, Md., March 13 (UPI)—The Maryland Bar Association, arguing that former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew violated a position of public trust, urged the State Court of Appeals today to disbar Mr. Agnew.

In a brief filed in answer to the arguments of Mr. Agnew's attorney that he should not be made a special example because of his former office, the bar association said that lawyers who were elected officials had a higher obligation than other attorneys.

"At the time the respondent was receiving payments and evading the payment of Federal income taxes, he was the Governor of the state of Maryland, the highest public office which the people of Maryland can bestow," the association's brief said.

The Appeals Court, final arbiter in the case, will hear further arguments April 2.
