21—Richard A. Neiss, a Yonkers businessman, and his young bride were found dead last night in their \$150,000
Chappaqua home, an apparent murder and suicide, according to police and medical tfficials.

The District Attorney's office said hat Mr. Neiss, who was 52 years old, had married his third wife, Margaret, who was in her twenties, last Friday night. Both had been shot in the head, with Mrs. Neiss having also suffered head cuts and a fraitured skull, the police said.

Mr. Neiss was said by a colleague to have been a childhood friend of Robert Abplanalp, a close friend of Presiden Nixon, and had mainvained a business reflationship with Mr. Abplanalp's Precision Valve Company in Yonkers for matic Laboratories of Yonkers, made the springs for the aerostl cans manufactured by Precision Valve Mr. Neiss founded his own company 19 years ago.

Homicide Is Ruled

Thomas Facelle, chief assistant district attorney, said that the bodies had been discovered shortly after 6:30 last night by a friend of the couple who was concerned because he had been unable to reach them by telephone during the day.
