Apology to 4 'Enemies'

President Nixon has sent letters of apology to four persons on the so-called White House enemies list, including a 75-year-old Milwaukee woman, the White House said yesterday.

Deputy Press Secretary Gerald L. Warren said Mr. Nixon had written replies in response to letters he received from four individuals, who wrote him about their inclusion on the enemies list. If others write similarly to the President, Warren indicated, Mr. Nixon will reply to them.

The enemies list was disclosed in testimony given during the Watergate investigations.

Anna Grapczynski of Milwaukee, who ended up on the enemies list after making a political contribution, said Thursday she has received a letter from Mr. Nixon and that she was pleased with it.

"I regret that such a list was ever drawn up by members of this administration," Mr. Nixon's letter to Mrs. Grapczynski said. "I appreciate your thoughtfulness in writing to me as you did, and I hope you will accept my apologies and regrets for the trouble and embarrassment this has brought you."
