Senator James L. Buckley of New York said yesterday that he has received more than 10,000 letters since he made his statement urging President Nixon to resign and that most of them had denounced his position.

The senator added, however, that some Republican colleagues in the Senate are now veering toward his position, and that one senator, a moderate Republican, is now "terribly close" to coming forward with a statement of public support.

Buckley, a Republican Conservative, last week urged the President to resign as "an extraordinary act of statesmanship and courage," because his continuation in office imperiled the presidency and the nation's institutions.
