

The Nixon Papers

The 1,176 boxes of Richard M. Nixon's pre-presidential papers that were transferred to the National Archives on March 26 and 27, 1969, included:

- 826 boxes of general correspondence, filed alphabetically.

- 173 boxes of domestic speaking engagement correspondence, filed chronologically.

- 56 boxes of correspondence regarding invitations

and the turn-down of invitations from 1954 to 1961.

- 116 foreign trip files of Mr. Nixon when he was Vice President, including 35 from South America, 26 from the Far East, 23 from the Soviet Union, 11 from Africa, seven from London, three from Austria and one miscellaneous.

- Three boxes on the visit of then-Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev's visit to the United States in 1959 and 1960.
