Dairy Cooperative Accused to \$40-Million Damage Suit in \$40-Million Damage

WICHITA FALLS, Tex., April 4 (UPI)—A \$40-million damage suit has been filed in Federal I court against Associated Milk Producers, Inc., of San Antonio, charging the huge dairy cooperative with controlling price of milk.

Mrs. J. D. Van Huss, owner of the Van Huss Dairy in the largest milk producing area in Texas, filed the actionon behalf of herself and an estimated total of 44,000 dairymen in the United States.

The 19-page Federal court petition charged A.M.P.I. with controlling prices of milk, creating a monopoly in handling milk from dairy to store and violating laws on sale of securities. The suit also seeks to void contracts the cooperative has with individual dairymen throughout the nation.
