

(AP) — Archibald Cox, the special Watergate prosecutor who was dismissed by President Nixon, says he is opposed to a bill before the Senate Judiciary Committee that would set up a permanent special prosecutor's office.

"I don't think that any President is so untrustworthy that we have to have a constant investigator looking into his activities," Mr. Cox said yesterday.
