Buckley Urges
Nixon to Cancel
Trip to Moscow

Senator James Buckley (Rep-N.Y.), who recently urged President Nixon to resign, said yesterday that Mr. Nixon should cancel his trip to Moscow in June.

"I strongly recommend against a presidential visit to Moscow while impeachment proceedings are still under way," Buckley said in a statement.

He said the failure of Secretary of State Henry Kissinger to work out a strategic arms limitation agreement during a recent trip to Moscow has "made it clear that the President's political differences at home have served to harden Soviet attitudes and positions."
