New U.S. Job For Son of

Nixon Lawyer

The son of President Nixon's tax lawyer has been appointed as an associate deputy attorney general at the Justice Department.

He is Jonathan C. Rose, 32, son of Cleveland attorney H. Chapman Rose, who was summoned by Mr. Nixon to represent him in some tax matters after his tax returns came under investigation a few months ago.

The younger Rose has been on Mr. Nixon's staff as general counsel for the White House Council on International Economic Policy since December, 1972.
