

Senate Study Of Report by 'Plumbers'

Two members of the Senate Armed Services Committee will review a White House report on security leaks as part of the committee's inquiry into alleged military spying, Chairman John C. Stennis (Dem-Miss.) announced yesterday.

Stennis said that Senators Stuart Symington (Dem-Mo.), and Barry Goldwater (Rep.-Ariz.), will review the so-called Young Report, prepared by the White House plumbers unit under their director, David Young.

Stennis said the review procedure was the result of extensive negotiations with the White House.

The report was prepared by the plumbers on White House security leaks and deals in part with alleged spying on the National Security Council in behalf of the Joint Chiefs of staff.

Stennis said Symington and Goldwater will report to the committee "as soon as they can do so, but obviously their review cannot be completed until after Congress reconvenes following the Easter holiday."
