Traxler Says He'll Wait and See

Washington

Representative-elect Bob Traxler (Dem-Mich.), said yesterday he thinks most people in the district that elected him to Congress last week want President Nixon impeached, but he would wait to review the evidence before making up his mind.

Traxler said a newspaper poll, showing that 54 per cent of those persons voting for him wanted to elect a man to impeach the President, was "a fair assessment."

But he added: "I view impeachment as a judicial proceeding. I said it before the election and I say it now. I perceive myself as a grand juror. Sitting in the House to make a determination if the President should stand trial in the Senate. I expect to fulfill that kind of obligation and judicial responsibility on the basis of the facts and evidence that's presented to me by the House Judiciary Committee.

Traxler was interviewed on CBS's "Face the Nation." Mr. Nixon focused nation-

al attention on the Michigan congressional race by campaigning for Traxler's opponent.

Traxler said the election last week was not a vote on Mr. Nixon personally. "I think it was a referendum on his disastrous policies and proposals and his inability to govern."
