TRAXLER TO AWAIT EVIDENCE ON NIXON

EVIDENCE ON NIXON

WASHINGTON, April 21 (AP)
—Representative - elect J. Bob
Traxler, the first Democrat to
win Michigan's Eigth Congressional District seat today that
he would take no stand on impeaching President Nixon until
the House Judiciary Committee
completed its findings.

Mr. Traxler's narrow victory
last week over his Republican
opponent, James M. Sparling
Jr., for whom Mr. Nixon personally campaigned, was seen by
many as a referendum on the
President—with the result adding impetus to the impeachment drive.

But Mr. Traxler, who was
interviewed on the Columbia
Broadcasting System's televivision program "Face the Nation," said he regarded "the
whole issue of Mr. Nixon's remaining or going" as "a judicial
question."

"I perceive myself as a grand
juror, sitting in the House,"
he said. "I will read the committee's report and make an independent determination as to
whether or not he ought to
stand trial in the Senate."
