Watergate special prosecutor Leon Jaworski said yesterday the government would prove that California Lieutenant Governor Ed Reinecke first discussed bringing the 1972 Republican convention to San Diego with ex-White House chief of staff H. R. Haldeman.

Such proof would contradict Reinecke's sworn Senate testimony that he first discussed the possibility with San Diego Chamber of Commerce representatives at a social reception here.

It would also establish high - level White House involvement in the effort to locate the convention in San Diego. The effort eventually led to allegations of a link between Justice Department settlement of antitrust suits against International Telephone and Telegraph Corp. and an offer by ITT - Sheraton Corp. to contribute as much as \$400,000 to help finance the convention.

Jaworski's statement concerning the alleged Haldeman - Reinecke discussion came in a federal court response opposing Reinecke's motion to dismiss a three count federal perjury indictment against the lieutenant governor that arose out of his Senate testimony on the ITT matter.
