A secluded hideaway full of Watergate secrets is up for sale. The price tag on the residence of convicted burglar E. Howard Hunt is \$139,500.

The 3.3-acre spread known as Witches Island is set back from a scenic Maryland road 13 miles out of Washington.

Hunt, out on bond after serving terms in two prisons, is living in the five-bedroom, 3½ bath dwelling until he finds a buyer. But he's ducking the questions of prospects, leaving all that to the real estate agent.

As potential purchasers are escorted through the place, Hunt holes up on the lower level in a cavernous paneled study.

He appears small and pale behind a massive circular desk, flanked by a tape recorder, books, mementos and pistols on the overhead wall.
