More Trouble for Mitchell and Stans

The acquittal of John N. Mitchell and Maurice H. Stans does not end the legal problems of the two former cabinet officers.

Mitchell, former attorney general and director of President Nixon's re-election campaign, has been indicted on six counts in the Watergate conspiracy case.

He is also believed to be a target of the special Watergate prosecutor's investigation in two other cases in which indictments have not yet been brought. These cases involve allegations that government favors were granted in return for pledges of large campaign contribu-

tions from dairy farmers and the International Telephone and Telegraph Corp.

Stans' problems are considerably less serious. But the staff of special prosecutor Leon Jaworski is reported to be investigating whether Stans, former secretary of commerce and director of the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President, solicited illegal corporate contributions to Mr. Nixon's campaign.

Pretrial motions in the Watergate case are scheduled to be argued next Wednesday in U.S. District Court here. The trial is due to start September 9.
