The Gurney Indictment

An indictment charging Senator Edward Gurney (Rep-Fla.), with violating state election laws was served yesterday on his attorney.

The lawyer said the charge was "vague and ambiguous" and immediately moved that it be dismissed

moved that it be dismissed.

Gurney, 60, a member of the Senate Watergate committee, was indicted on a misdemeanor charge of failing to report campaign contributions and accepting contributions without naming a campaign treasurer.

C. Harris Dittmar, Gurney's attorney, said the sengtor will plead not guilty.

A hearing on the motion to dismiss was scheduled for next Tuesday before County Judge Charles McClure. Gurney was given until May 8 to plead to the charge. A

trial date may be set at that time.

A conviction on the charge carries a maximum penalty of one year in jail and a \$1000 fine.
