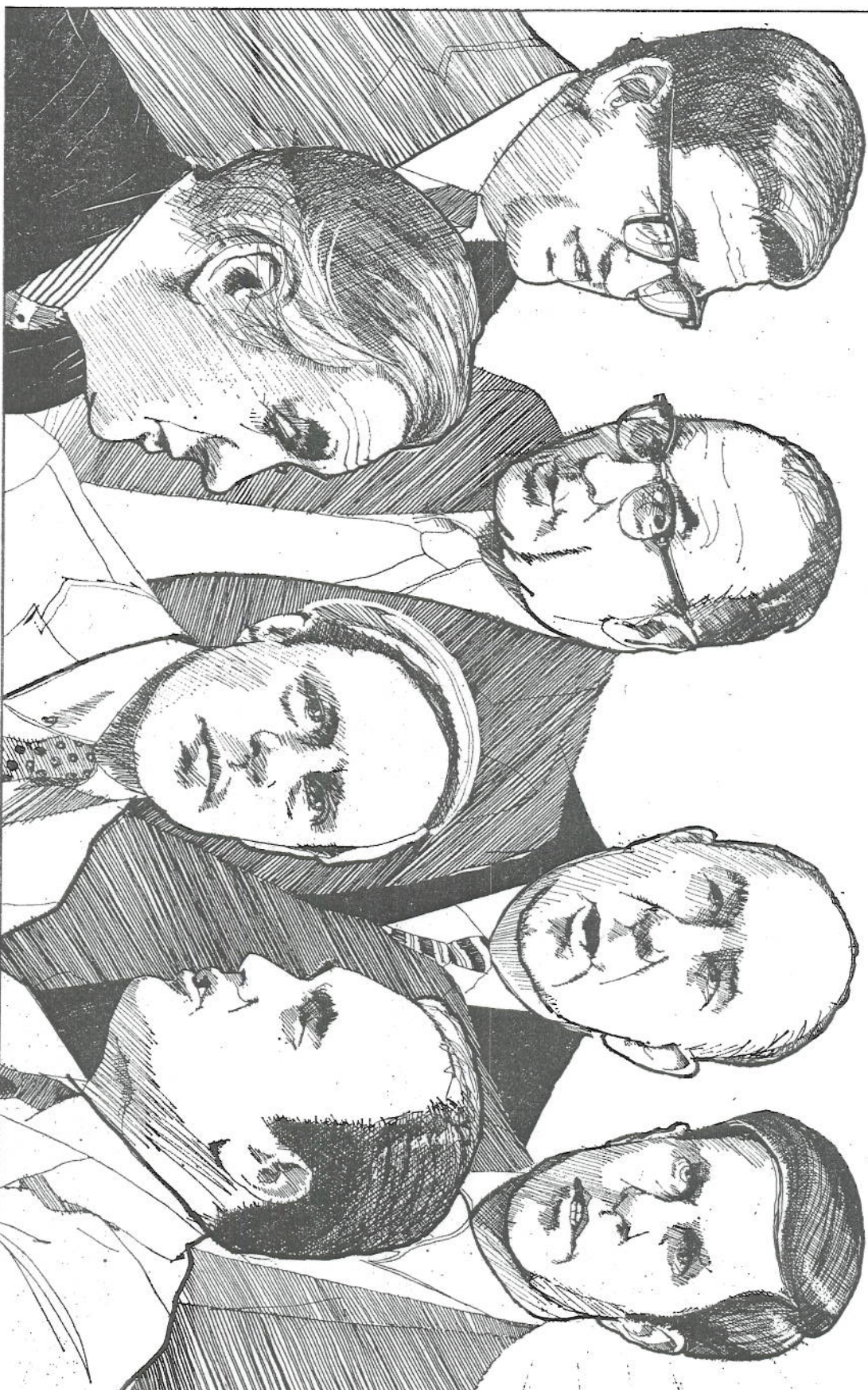

WASHINGTON, May 1—Following are the identities of persons described by initials in the transcripts of the White House tapes:

- P. President Nixon.
- H. H. R. Haldeman, former White House chief of staff.
- E. John D. Ehrlichman, former assistant to the President for domestic affairs.
- K. Richard G. Kleindienst, former Attorney General.
- Z. Ronald L. Ziegler, press secretary to the President.

Following is a list of the persons mentioned in the transcripts of the White House tapes:

- A. Acree, Vernon D. (Mike)—Commissioner of Bureau of Customs.
- Adams, Sherman—top assistant to President Eisenhower who resigned in a gift-taking scandal.
- Alexander, John—probably Mr. Nixon's former law partner from the firm of Mudge Rose, Guthrie & Alexander.
- Barker, Bernard—convicted Watergate conspirator.

Chapin, Dwight L.—former Presidential appointments secretary.

Childs, Marquis W.—Syndicated columnist.

Colson, Charles W.—Former special counsel to President Nixon.

Dale, Francis L. (Frank)—Former chairman of the Committee for the Re-election of the President and currently United States representative to the European office of the United Nations.

Garment, Leonard—Counsel to the President.

Greenspun, Hank—Publisher of The Las Vegas Sun.

Higby, Lawrence M.—Former assistant to H. R. Haldeman.

Hofgren, Daniel W. (Danny)—Former vice chairman of the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President.

Kilpatrick, James M.—Syndicated columnist.

Kissinger, Henry A.—Secretary of State and foreign affairs adviser to the President.

Krogh, Egil Jr.—Former chief assistant

to John D. Ehrlichman.

Magruder, Jeb Stuart—Former chief of staff, Committee for the Re-election of the President.

Mardian, Robert C.—Former deputy manager, Committee for the Re-election of the President.

Maroulis, Peter L.—Attorney for G. Gordon Liddy.

McCord, James W., Jr.—Convicted participant in the Watergate break-in.

McGrory, Mary—Columnist for The Washington Star-News.

Moore, Richard A.—Special counsel to the President.

O'Brien, Lawrence F.—Democratic National Chairman at the time of the Watergate burglary.

Parkinson, Kenneth W.—Attorney for the Committee for the Re-election of the President.

Petersen, Henry E.—Assistant Attorney General, who headed Watergate inquiry in the Justice Department.

Porter, Herbert L.—Scheduling director for the Committee for the Re-election of the President.

Rather, Dan—C.B.S.'s White House correspondent.

Rush, Kenneth—Former Ambassador, now Deputy Secretary of State.

Segretti, Donald H.—Convicted saboteur of Democratic campaigns.

Shapiro, David—Law partner of Charles Colson.

Silbert, Earl J.—First chief prosecutor in Watergate.

Sloan, Hugh—Former treasurer, Finance Committee to Re-elect the President.

Strachan, Gordon—Former assistant to H. R. Haldeman.

Szulc, Tad—Former reporter for The New York Times.

Timmons, William E.—Director of Congressional relations for the White House.

Wallace, Mike—Television correspondent for CBS.

Williams, John—Former Republican Senator from Delaware.

Wilson, Richard—Syndicated columnist.

Young, David R. Jr.—Former White House aide.
