Knowledge of Plumbers Denied Again by Kissinger

WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP)—Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger denied again today that he had any knowledge of the White House "plumbers" group or the involvement of a former aide, David R. Young Jr., in the investigation of domestic security matters.

Mr. Kissinger, who is in the Middle East, made the denial through a State Department spokesman, Paul Hare, here in response to an affidavit by John D. Ehrlichman, the former Presidential assistant.

The affidavit charged that Mr. Kissinger sat in on a meeting in California during July, 1971, when Mr. Young was recruited for the plumbers group.
