**TRANSCRIPT REPORTS
SATISFY NIXON AIDES**

WASHINGTON, May 3 (UPI)—White House officials appeared generally satisfied today with the newspaper reporting of the Watergate transcripts and said the accounts were "beginning to report and say that the President was not involved" in the cover-up.

A high White House official said that immediately after the transcripts were released Tuesday there was, as expected, "a focusing on the most controversial sections of the tapes and details of the dramatic disclosures."

"These early reports, again as was expected, do not fully place into focus the full Watergate story as told by the 1,300-page book and that was expected," he said. "But we do find that as the days pass reporters have a chance to read the full volume, they are focusing on the substance and they are finding and beginning to report and say that the President was not involved."
