ANN ARBOR. Mich., May 4 (UPI)—Vice President Ford said today the transcripts of President Nixon's Watergate tapes "do not exactly confer sainthood cerned." on anyone con-

He said he could not understand how anyone could criti-cize the President for taking his case to the people unless what the critics really wanted was to negate the verdict of the people.
