

In Support of the President

After 60 Republican women affirmed their faith in the President yesterday at the White House, Pat Nixon told reporters:

"We get this kind of assurance from all over the country every day about how people feel. It's not just how the press feels. And it gives the President a great lift."

Mrs. Nixon told Mrs. Gordon Lamont, of New York and Florida, chairman of the council of the Women's National Republicans Club and a longtime friend, about the Watergate situation: "We will win because we are right."

Mrs. Lamont had written Mrs. Nixon that the council would be in session in Washington at this time "because we want it understood by everyone that we are solidly and wholeheartedly back of the President."

The council had reaffirmed a resolution at its current meetings endorsing the President and his programs.
