Pilot Denied Bail

BALTIMORE, May 11 (AP)

—A member of the military has no constitutional right to bail, a federal judge in Baltimore ruled Friday in refusing to release the 20-year-old Army private who landed a stolen helicopter on the White House lawn in a blaze of gunfire Feb. 17.

Thomas Farquahar, a law-yer for Pfc. Robert K. Preston, argued before Judge Joseph H. Young that "a person doesn't forfeit his constitutional rights in the military."

Preston, now confined in the Ft. Meade stockade, will be arraigned Thursday at Ft. Meade for his court-martial on charges of stealing a helicopter, damaging the craft, assault with a deadly weapon and illegally entering the White House grounds.
