## WXPosf way 12 174 Bail Is Denied In Copter Case

BALTIMORE, May 10 (UPI)

A federal judge refused today to order bail for a young
Army private accused of commandeering a helicopter Feb.
17 at Ft. Meade, Md., then
crash-landing the craft on the
White House lawn in a flurry
of shotgun fire.

U.S. District Judge Joseph
H. Young, denying the plea
for freedom by Pfc. Robert
K. Preston, ruled a "member
of the military has no constitutional rights under the
eighth amendment" concerning pretrial detention.

An Army mechanic who
washed out of pilot school,
Preston, 20, has been held in
the Ft. Meade stockade pending court-martial on charges
of stealing the helicopter,
damaging the craft and aggravated assault.

Capta Peter Dresler of the
judge advocate general's office said Preston was confined
because of the seriousness of
the charges and admitted suicidal tendencies prior to the
Feb. 17 incident.
