Philadelphia

A public opinion poll that shows 35.3 per cent of the country wants President Nixon to resign, and 29.9 per cent want him impeached, has been mailed to 6000 newspaper editors, broadcasters and White House supporters across the country.

The poll, showing that a majority of the country wanst Mr. Nixon to stay in office, was mailed by the White House. It was taken by the Albert Sindlinger Co., a suburban Philadelphia firm, and differs significantly from other public opinion polls released in the past week.

Sindlinger said his firm surveyed 1677 voters be-

tween April 29 and May 10. He said the poll shows that 55 per cent of the country wants the President to remain in office, 44 per cent

want him out of office and 1 per cent are undecided.

Sindlinger said the survey mailed by the White House contained only information gathered between April 29 and May 5, and that in the last five days of polling the number of persons wanting Mr. Nixon out of office went up.

A Harris poll released over the weekend showed that 49 per cent of the country wanted Mr. Nixon removed from office, while 41 per cent did not. The remaining 10 per cent were undecided.
