Walking to Blair House

The "resident walker," otherwise known to White House aides as First Lady Pat Nixon, took a brief stroll yesterday across the street to a Blair House reception.

It was her second such outing in two days. She revealed to reporters that she had gone incognito to a park on Tuesday.

She said she wore a scarf and sunglasses and was accompanied by a friend but declined to say which park because, "I don't want to bump into one of you any of these days."

In contrast, yesterday's stroll was totally public in the company of reporters, photographers and Secret Service agents, but was otherwise unventful. Passersby on Pennsylvania Avenue appeared to recognize her but none attempted to speak.
