

Mrs. Graham Given Ovation at Columbia On Honorary L.L.D.

The longest applause at the Columbia University commencement yesterday greeted the award of an honorary degree of Doctor of Laws to Mrs. Katharine Graham, publisher of The Washington Post.

The award to Mrs. Graham noted: "Since 1963 you have been the crusading publisher of The Washington Post, and in that position steadfastly committed to the highest standards of journalism and the vital principle of integrity in government."

Honorary Doctor of Laws degrees also were conferred on Frederick H. Burkhardt, president of the American Council of Learned Societies; Lawrence A. Wien, real-estate lawyer, and Governor Malcolm Wilson.

Honorary Doctorates of Sciences were conferred on Michael Heidelberger of the New York University School of Medicine and Seymour Benzer, professor of biology at the California Institute of Technology, biologist.

Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degrees were given Paul O. Kristeller, emeritus professor of philosophy at Columbia; Henry Moore, the sculptor; Arnaldo Momigliano, professor of ancient history at the universities of London and Turin, and the late Louis I. Kahn, architect.
