St. Louis Post-Dispatch was about to publish an article on a \$205,000 loan that Mr. Hughes had made in 1956 to F. Donald Nixon, a brother of the then Presidential candidate. Mr. Maheu said that "we were successful in delaying the story until after the election," but that the arrangement was destroyed when Richard M. Nixon and his campaign ad-visers decided to leak the story to a friendly columnist, Peter Edson.

'Sensitive Assignment' Mr. Maheu said the column appeared "with many misstate-ments in it' and that the late Drew Pearson, who also had withheld publication of a column about the dealing, then decided to tell what he knew of the loan. Mr. Nixon was defeated by a narrow margin. Mr. Maheu also testified that in 1960 Mr. Hughes wanted him to come from Miami to Los An-
