Haig Takes Second Look At His Job

Newsweek magazine reported yesterday that White House chief of staff Alexander M. Haig is so disturbed by the transcripts of the Watergate tapes that he has had to "back up and reevaluatehis job."

The magazine quotes Haig, 49, as saying of the tapes: "I'm not proud of them," and noting that "I am an historical phenomenon — the first active duty general who had to retire from military service to enter combat."
