U.S. District Court Judge John J. Sirica has given the White House until May 31 to turn over 64 Watergate-related tapes Jaworski says he needs for the trials of top former Nixon aides accused of the Watergate cover-up. However. the White House has indicated it won't comply, but will appeal the case.

Ford's statements, urging a compromise without specifying how it would be achieved, were coupled with repeated insistence that Mr. Nixon is innocent and won't be impeached.
