

LANGUAGE ON TAPES

HELD NOT TOO DIRTY

WASHINGTON, May 26

(UPI)—Members of the House Judiciary Committee, who have been listening to tape recordings of President Nixon's conversations, report that the language is not nearly so dirty as might be imagined by readers of the transcripts from which expletives were deleted.

One Republican member suggests that Mr. Nixon would have lost less esteem if he had published the transcripts with the raw language left intact.

"People read into the deletions the worst thing that comes into their minds," the Representative said.

Many observers believe that the transcripts hurt Mr. Nixon as much for what is seen as their tone of amorality as for their content.
