38% Pro-Nixon in Poll Held 'Loyalist Bastion'

NEW YORK, May 27 (UPI)
—While President Nixon now has fewer supporters than he did in August, those remaining are "solidifying into a loyalist bastion that is supporting him with growing determination," according to a poll conducted one week after Mr. Nixon released edited transcripts of tape-recorded White scripts of tape-recorded White House conversations.

An August survey made for

Time magazine by Daniel Yan-kelovich, Inc., showed 60 per cent of the respondents in fa-vor of the President's remain-

ing in office.

Today that figure is down to Today that figure is down to 38 per cent, according to another Yankelovich survey for this week's issue of the magazine. There are "significant differences" between the two groups, the survey shows.

"Compared with the August"

"Ithe prevailing view that politics is a dirty game."

"The conviction that the President has the right to bend the law a little—even to the best interests of the nation."

Those defending the President, according to the poll, base their support on three beliefs:

"A feeling that the President's associates are to blame for his troubles rather than Nixon himself."
