Guilty Plea in Milk Funds Case

Washington

A second ousted official of a Pennsylvania milk cooperative pleaded guilty yesterday in connection with the group's \$50,000 contribution to President Nixon's 1972 re-election campaign.

Chief U.S. District Judge George L. Hart Jr. sentenced Francis X. Carroll, the Washington representative for Lehigh Valley Cooperative Farmers of Allentown, Pa., to a suspended term of 30 days unsupervised probation.

Carroll pleaded guilty to

an information filed by special Watergate prosecutor Leon Jaworski charging that he nonwilfully aided and abetted in making the contribution.

The crime carried a maximum penalty of one year in prison and a \$1000 fine. Earlier this month, Richard L. Allison, former president of the 970-member co-op. pleaded guilty in connection with the contribution and was given a sentence of a suspended \$1000 fine and 30 days unsupervised probation.
