The Pentagon disclosed yesterday that Gen. Creighton W. Abrams, the Army Chief of Staff, has lung cancer. "Further tests will be performed to determine the extent of the malignancy," a spokesman said. "Medical authorities will then determine the appropriate treat-ment." The 59-year-old general was admitted to Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington last week, after he cut short a two-week tour of American bases in Europe. When it was first disclosed this week that he had been hospitalized, the official announcement said General Abrams was suffering from a mild case of pneumonia." His aides said the general was/a cigar smoker, but that his tobacco use has been moderate.
