## Magruder Begins His Prison Term

Lewisburg, Pa.

Jeb S. Magruder, No. 2 man in President Nixon's re-election campaign, entered a minimum security federal prison near here yesterday to begin serving a sentence for conspiracy in the Watergate case.

Magruder's wife, Gail, drove their car into the Allenwood federal prison complex.

The onetime presidential aide - the sixth former White House employee sent to prison in connection with the Watergate scandal told newsmen he will devote his prison term to "philosophy and theology more than anything else."

Magruder pleaded guilty last August to a single count of conspiracy to obstruct

justice and defraud the United States.

U.S. District Court Judge John Sirica sentenced Magruder on May 20 to a term of from ten months to four

While at the Allenwood prison camp - with its open and unguarded front gate Magruder will live in a barrack-like room with about 100 other inmates.

Allenwood prisoners can take college courses, work at area industries or play softball in a local league. They are eligible for community family visits, a program under which Magruder would be allowed to go home for one day every two months.
