Leon Jaworski, the Watergate special prosecutor, has asked the Senate for \$2,804,000 to conduct the business of his office over the next fiscal year, and indications are he will have little trouble getting the funds. When he appeared before the Appropriations Committee, Senator John O. Pastore, Democrat of Rhode Island, told him: "You're a busy man, Mr. Jaworski; we won't delay you any longer.
