

# Kunstler Hints White House Has Wounded Knee Tapes

ST. PAUL, June 6 (UPI)—  
William M. Kunstler said yesterday that he had talked with former White House counsel John W. Dean 3d in California about the possible taping of conversations concerning the 1973 occupation of Wounded Knee, S. D.

Mr. Kunstler, defense attorney in the trial of two American Indian Movement leaders, Dennis Banks and Russell Means, said he was sure Mr. Dean had not been part of the discussions but he said he was sure there had been such discussions.

The persons most likely to have been involved in those discussions, Mr. Dean said, were Leonard Garment, a former White House aide; the head of the plumbers unit, Egil Krogh Jr.; John D. Ehrlichman, former aide to the President, and possibly H. R. Haldeman, former Presidential chief of staff.
