CAIRO — Cairo's plushest hotel — the Nile Hilton — was commandeered yesterday for 500 American officials and journalists flying in for President Nixon's three-day Egyptian visit that begins tomorrow.

A spokesman for the Hilton said the hotel will be closed to the public until Friday afternoon when President Nixon flies from here to Saudi Arabia.

The spokesman said that all of the evicted guests — including British tourists — had been found rooms in nine other smaller Cairo hotels.

U.S. embassy and Egyptian officials said here that 600 American officials and 500 American and other journalists had begun flying into Cairo in the biggest ever influx of Americans into Egypt.

For the second day, hundreds of American and Egyptian security men continued searching rooftops for possible sniper's nests.

Special precautions were being taken against possible attack from extremist Palestine guerrilla groups.
